Drawing Birds in the Western Landscape - Morning Session

This is a great way to learn quick references for bird identification. This class is suitable for children. Bring your favorite drawing and sketching materials and something to share for a potluck lunch.

Techniques and Tricks - Afternoon Session

Learn water color and colored pencil techniques, perspective, composition, Pein Air techniques and some new thoughts color theory while using the museum's buildings, artifacts and landscapes as inspiration. Bring whatever medium(s) you wish to work in.
